Use...

Democracy- a system of government by the whole population or all the eligible members of a state, typically through elected representatives.  
Debate- a formal discussion on a particular matter in a public meeting or legislative assembly, in which opposing arguments are put forward and which usually ends with a vote.  
Athens- the capital and largest city of Greece; named after Athena (its patron goddess).  
Sparta- an ancient Greek city famous for military prowess.  
Olympics- the modern revival of the ancient games held once every 4 years in a selected country.

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Myth- a traditional story, especially one concerning the early history of a people or explaining a natural or social phenomenon, and typically involving supernatural beings or events.
