Think deeply about...

- What different traditional tales have you read?
- What fairy tale characters can you name?
- How do fairytales start and end?
- Can you say which characters you like and dislike and why?

Learn...

- Some common traditional tales such as The Enormous Turnip, The Three Bears, The Three Little Pigs.
- To begin to learn the main characters in a story.
- To begin to retell stories using story language such as Once Upon a time, And they lived happily ever after, The end.
- To know what a turnip is and what plants need to grow.
- To re-tell the story of The Enormous Turnip.
- To try some different vegetables/fruits they may not as tried.

Use...

- Once upon a time - traditional tale opening.
- The End - how a story finishes.
- Characters - the main people or animals in the story.
- Baddies - the villain or person who does something bad in the story.
- Turnip - a vegetable that grows in the ground.



Explore...

- Look read or listen to a wide range of Traditional Tales.

- Go and visit Mile Cross Library - it is free to join and you can choose some new stories you have never heard before.
- Talk about your favourite story. Why do you like it?
- Sing the song When Goldilocks went to the house of the bears.
- Try some fairy tale inspired foods e.g. porridge (Goldilocks) turnip (The Enormous Turnip) green beans (Jack and the Beanstalk) Gingerbread (The Little Gingerbread Man).
