This enquiry investigates the reasons behind the choice of Mary as Jesus' mother and how her conception of Jesus was due to the Holy Spirit.

Christians celebrate the arrival of Jesus as God's Son. God chose a Jewish young woman called Mary, who was engaged to Joseph the carpenter, to be the mother of his earthly son and sent his angel, Gabriel, to ask this of her. This is called the annunciation. Mary agreed to allow this to happen and Jesus was born in Bethlehem. Mary was a virgin, so this was a miracle. This is the Christian concept of " <b>incarnation</b> ": God becoming man or literally being "made flesh". A common misconception is that this event was done to Mary without her consent, or with very little choice. However, the Christian belief in free will precludes this and in response to the angel, Mary says " <i>Here am I, the servant of the Lord; let it be with me according to your word.</i> " (Luke 1:38) Some Christians believe the virgin birth is symbolic of humanity and divinity joining. Jesus needed to be human and divine in order to bring salvation, so what better way to show this than by Jesus having a human mother and a divine father.		<ul> <li>Trinity: consubstantial relationship between God (the Father), God (the Son) and The Holy Spirit.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Do I think it is possible that somebody could live without doing anything wrong ever in their lives?</li> <li>Would this make them very special? So, Christians believe that not only was her conception of Jesus miraculous, but her own life had been without any wrong-doing in order to prepare her for the question that God would ask of her, to be the mother of Jesus.
